You might have noticed from the heading that we are returning to *Imlitir* and our aim is to send one out each Monday, as we did when in the school building. We also aim to have an assembly on Fridays @ 9.30, as is usual. I was hoping to do one last Friday but ran into some technology difficulties. The staff meet every day and use Hangouts Meet but this only facilitates 100 users. I then looked into both Zoom and 3CX but there were issues over microphones for up to 500 people. I also considered Facebook Live. but then not everyone is on Facebook and there is an age limit of 13 years. I have registered with Youtube and hope to live stream this Friday @ 9.30. It won't have interaction with the pupils but we may be able to do that at class level with Hangouts Meet.

**Scratch:** As you are aware the school uses this programme to teach coding to the pupils. The Infant teachers have included Junior Scratch activities in their work allocation, being aware that it will only run on a limited selection of devices. Miss Debby will be teaching Scratch lessons to:

Last week a survey was sent for **permission to use Google Suite for Education**, which includes Hangouts Meet. If you are agreeable to give permission, please click the appropriate box on the form. If your preference is not to, please click that box, to make us aware of your preference. All work/tasks will still be sent by email.

Some First Class parents have enquired about **enrolments for St Michael's** next year. They have asked me to let you know that they will be contacting you after Easter. Taking GDPR into account, we will send you their communication and you can choose to reply directly to them. No need to worry. They will be in touch.

Second Class parents have been in touch regarding the **First Holy Communion**. I have spoken to Fr Paul and he says that it is too soon to make a decision yet. He is awaiting instruction from Bishop Deenihan and will let us know, as soon as that arrives.

We are **reviewing our enrolment policy** in line with a recent circular (007/2020) from the Department of Education and Science (DES). We will send you a copy of this circular and our current enrolment policy tomorrow and welcome any feedback that you can give us, specifically in relation to compliance with the circular. Do not feel under any pressure to complete the questionnaire, we perfectly understand, given the current circumstances. The staff will also be asked for feedback and it will be on the agenda for our next Board of Management meeting on April 24<sup>th</sup>.
