Next week we will be celebrating **Catholic Schools Week**. This week gives everyone involved in Catholic education the opportunity to acknowledge and celebrate the contribution that our Catholic schools make to Irish life. This year's theme is: 'Catholic Schools: Celebrating the work of our Local Catholic Schools.' As society changes, it is important that we reflect on the unique contribution of Catholic Schools to our collective goal of education. Each Catholic school shares an ethos that is inclusive, welcoming and vibrant. Each school works towards a vision of each student as made in the image and likeness of God. This means we work towards helping each child, irrespective of background, ethnicity or creed, reach their potential, academically, spiritually and socially.

As a Catholic School we will be celebrating our ethos by engaging in various activities next week. Parents may like to check out the website: www.catholicschoole.ie On Friday Jan 25th, room 13 will launch Catholic Schools Week, and on Jan 30th we will have Grandparents' Day. All grandparents' are invited in from 10.30am to join us for a cup of tea in the School Hall. Some may wish to visit their grandchildren's classes after this to talk about the good ole days. Any grandparent who wishes, may collect their grandchildren and bring them to Mass at 10am on Jan 30th. There will be a special blessing for grandparents issued at that Mass. When they leave the children back after Mass, they may have a cuppa in the school.

On Jan 27th Room 19 will close the week with an assembly in the hall.

The next big celebration we will have as a Catholic School is the **Confirmation on Feb 9th**. We will welcome out new Bishop, Thomas Deenihan to Trim that day. We wish our 6th classes the very best as they make their final preparations for this big event in their lives. We would also like to thank Fr Sean and Fr Warren for their pastoral care and guidance throughout the year.

We would like to take this opportunity to pay tribute to the Sisters of Mercy, in particular Srs Paula, Claudia and Immaculata, who are still very much involved with us here at St Mary's and to all those past sisters whose ethos and spirit continue to live on and inspire our teaching and learning.

Consent Forms: As you may be aware, we have been working on a new annual consent/permission form and a system for sending and returning it by email. Up to now, we had included one in our enrolment form and that was used for the duration of your child's stay in St Mary's. From now on, we will send consent/permission forms each year. We are glad to announce that our new system is ready to go and will be sent this week. Keep an eye out for the email and please return at your earliest convenience. Hard copies of the form are also available from the office.

Flipped Classroom: This is a system whereby classwork is done at home and homework is done at school (flipped!). It has been identified as one of our Digital Technology initiatives, this year. We are piloting it for Irish, from now until the end of the school year, with Rooms 16 and 19. The pupils will access prepared oral Irish lessons at home on any online-ready device, and teachers will monitor their work online. We will review it from the perspective of the pupils, parents and teachers, at the end of the school year. An explanatory letter has been sent to Rooms 16 and 19 today.

Towels: We are in the process of changing from towels and see two options: paper towels and hand driers. Being a Green School, we are anxious not to create a lot of paper waste, so we are doing a trial with a hand drier in Room 19. The drier has been purchased and I am just awaiting an electrician to install it. We will keep you posted.

OPEN DAY last week was a very well received and as usual the pupils stole the show. The Sixth Class girls received many compliments regarding their deportment and demeanour, and many people remarked on the entertainment provided by the Banna (School Band) and Cór (school choir). The Green Screen, Scratch and Augmented Reality were complimented also. Some current parents used the opportunity to have a walk around and see the school in action. I would like to thank our Parents' Association for their support and to thank all young and old who helped in any way.

School Registration Forms for children starting school in September 2019 are still available from Helen, in the office. Please note that the Final Submission Date for return of forms is this Friday January 25th and that offers will be posted on Friday February 1st.

Parent Teacher Meetings for Special Ed. will take place on Friday 8th and Monday 11th February. Bookings will be done online like last year. You will be able to log in and chose your time for the day. Junior Infants and rooms 9&12 meetings are on February 18th and 19th. Please contact the school if you did not get your note, to chose a time online.

Please ensure that your child has a coat coming to school this weather. They will need to wear one in the yard also.

Digital Technology News: This week students are creating conversations between two sprites. They are learning how to work independently when creating these animations. Please keep asking your child/ren what they are doing in Computers each week. Also just to clarify: Scratch is a free piece of software that can be downloaded by clicking on the following link: <https://scratch-kids.en.softonic.com/download> It is safe to download and allows children to develop an interest in coding.

Confirmation Classes: The Sacrament of Confirmation will take place on Saturday, 9th February at 11am.
