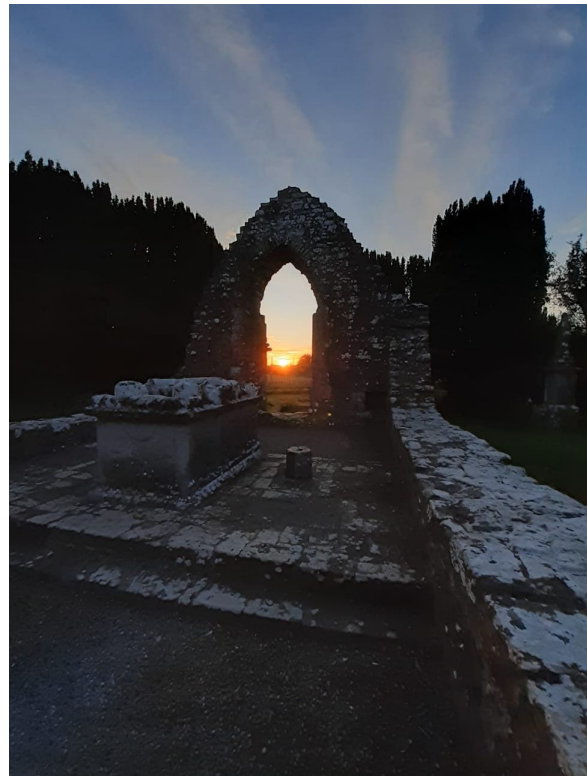

Darkness into Light



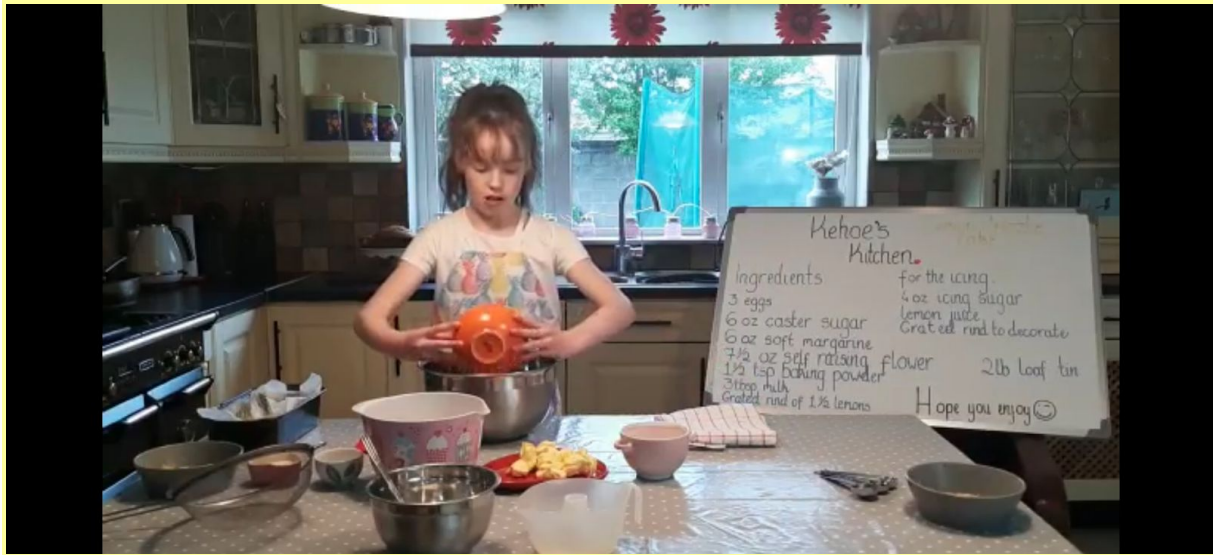

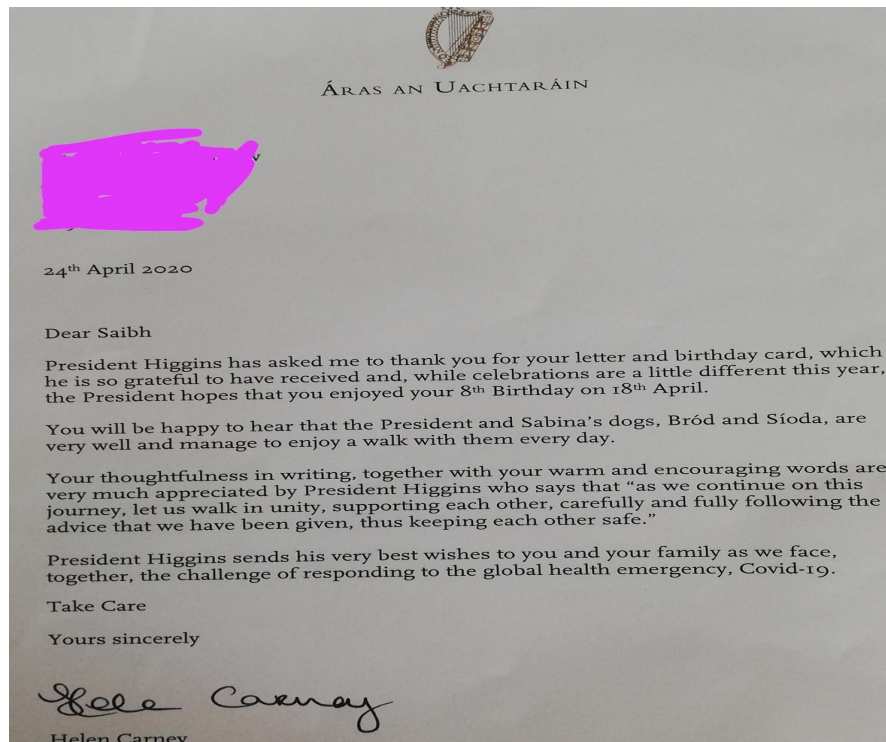
